#### WHAT SHOULD **I DO AFTER** MV GCSES?

It is important to consider what you want to do after you have finished your GCSEs.

It is important to make the right choices as they may affect future plans and goals e.g., what you can study at university.

There are different types of qualifications which will suit different learning styles and subject interests.

#### What works for you?

#### A levels

- Do you prefer assessment through examinations?
- Would you like to study, in-depth, a number of subjects rather than a single course?
- Do you definitely want to go to university, but want to keep your options open in regards to university courses and future careers?

### Vocational (e.g., BTECs) and Technical (T Levels)

- Are you interested in sector based subjects/courses e.g., engineering, applied science, performing arts, public services, health and social care....?
- Would you prefer to be assessed more by coursework and projects than by examinations? 3 Would you like to do a course which involves
- applying learning to practical activities/situations, including work experience placements?

#### Apprenticeships >> Would you prefer to learn whilst working in a paid job?

- Do you have a particular career in mind which you would like to gain practical experience in?
- Do you prefer to learn by observing others and then trying the task yourself? >>
- Would you like to do a full-time job which combines learning in the workplace with related training and study? »

#### Struggling to decide what qualifications and subjects to pick? Consider the following...

- >> What subjects have you enjoyed studying in the past?
- >> What subjects have you done well in?
- Do you have a future career plan in mind and if so, does it require specific subject knowledge and qualifications?
- What are your strongest skills (e.g., communication, leadership, teamwork .. and what subjects do they link to most?
- Would you prefer to follow an academic or vocational route or a combination of both?

#### FACT/FICTION?

All universities only accept A levels for entry on to their courses

#### FICTION

A levels may be required for some university courses but they are just one of many qualifications (e.g., BTECs & T Levels) accepted by universities

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
